STANDARDIZED SCORES

The Terra Nova Standardized test has been given each year to our students in Grades 2-6 in October. On the national Terra Nova Tests, our students score above grade level in reading, math, science and social studies. Our students score 50% higher than the national average and according to the "Nation's Report Card" (NAEP) Catholic elementary students outperform their peers in reading and math. In the spring of 2010, the Archdiocese of Boston has selected the Stanford 10 Standardized Test to measure student progress toward high academic standards.

SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

Our primary purpose at Holy Name Parish School is to provide an excellent education in a Catholic atmosphere. Our students will learn to use their gifts and talents academically and to achieve their best.
